

The Public Hearing regarding proposed Local Law #2-2006 Historic Preservation Chapter 22 was held on May 4, 2006 at 7:00pm at the Accord Fire Hall.

Supervisor Duke opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

Supervisor Duke explained that the Town Board received a recommendation from the Town's Historic Preservation Commission for the amendment and restatement of the Town's existing Historic Preservation Law. All Commissions have the right to submit recommendations to the Town Board for consideration at any time. The Historic Preservation Commission recommendation is as a new law, which requires a public hearing. Copies of this proposed law is available at the Town Clerk's Office.

Alice Cross, chair of the Historic Preservation Commission introduced and explained the key features of the draft law.

OPEN TO THE PUBLIC:

For over 90 minutes residents spoke, and with few exceptions most expressed concerns with the revised law as currently drafted. Several Commission members were there to take notes which will become the basis for making revisions.
